1. Terms of Reference

1.1 Based on the Service Agreement (No.: AA902), the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ), in the capacity of the Accreditation Authority as provided for under the Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications Ordinance (AAVQO) (Cap. 592), was commissioned by Occupational Safety and Health Management Institute (the Institute/Operator) to conduct a Learning Programme Re-Accreditation (re-LPA) with the following Terms of Reference:

- (a) To conduct an accreditation test as provided for in the AAVQO to determine whether the Professional Certificate in Safety Auditing programme of the Operator meets the stated objectives and Hong Kong Qualification Framework (QF) standards and can continue to be offered as an accredited programme; and
- (b) To issue to the Operator an accreditation report setting out the results of the determination in relation to (a) by HKCAAVQ.

2. HKCAAVQ'S Determination

Learning Programme Re-Accreditation

2.1 HKCAAVQ has determined that, subject to the fulfilment of the condition and compliance with the restriction set out below, the Professional Certificate in Safety Auditing programme meets the stated objectives and QF standard at Level 4, and can continue to be offered as an accredited programme with a validity period of two years.

2.2 Validity Period

2.2.1 The validity period will commence on the date specified below. Operators may apply to HKCAAVQ to vary the commencement date of the validity period. Applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

2.2.2 The maintenance of the accreditation status within the specified validity period is subject to the fulfilment of all requirements set out in Section 2.4 by the specified deadline.

2.4 Condition

2.4.1 Requirement

The Institute is to review and revise the examination questions to:

- (i) provide better guidance for the students to demonstrate their ability to apply Safety Auditing skills, including evaluation of relevant information; and,
- (ii) minimise repetition of examination questions among different sets of examination papers.

The Institute is to submit the six sets of revised examination papers together with their approval records to HKCAAVQ on the fulfilment of the above requirement **on or before 31 May 2024**.

2.5 Restriction

- 2.5.1 The Institute is to maintain the validity of the approval status granted by the Labour Department to ensure the qualification of the Programme is recognised for the purpose of registration as Safety Auditors. The Institute must inform HKCAAVQ immediately in case there is any change in the approval status.

2.6 Recommendation

HKCAAVQ also offers the following recommendations for continuous improvement of the Programme.

- 2.6.1 The Institute should review PILO1 with better defined scope of “各種工作場所” following the internal quality assurance procedures and regulatory requirements with proper record.
- 2.6.2 The Institute should update the rubrics of the Audit Project with the description of grading criteria to enhance consistent and standardised marking among the teaching team.
- 2.6.3 The Institute should follow through the review processes of the training materials, including the reference information; and, strengthen programme administration with improved documentation management to enhance the relevancy, currency and effectiveness of the Programme in meeting the PO.

- 2.7 HKCAAVQ will subsequently satisfy itself whether the Operator remains competent to achieve the relevant objectives and the Programme continues to meet the standard to achieve the relevant objectives as claimed by the Operator by reference to, amongst other things, the Operator's fulfilment of any conditions and compliance with any restrictions stipulated in this Accreditation Report. For the avoidance of doubt, maintenance of accreditation status is subject to fulfilment of any condition and compliance with any restriction stipulated in this Accreditation Report.

3. Introduction

- 3.1 Occupational Safety and Health Management Institute (OSHMI) (the Institute) was established in 1998. The Institute provides training courses and materials in the area of health, safety and environmental protection for the construction industry and other industries. The Institute was granted the Initial Evaluation status at QF Level 4 by HKCAAVQ in May 2021 and offers an HKCAAVQ-accredited programme, the Professional Certificate in Safety Auditing programme.
- 3.2 The Operator commissioned HKCAAVQ to conduct a re-LPA for the Professional Certificate in Safety Auditing programme (the Programme). HKCAAVQ formed an expert Panel for this exercise and visited the Institute on 8 and 9 June 2023. HKCAAVQ's *Manual for the Four-stage Quality Assurance Process under HKQF (Version 1.2, November 2020)* was the guiding document for the Operator and the Panel in conducting this exercise.

4. Programme Details

The following programme information is provided by the operator.

4.1 Programme Objectives (only available in Chinese)

4.2 Programme Intended Learning Outcomes (only available in Chinese)

- PILO1 在各種工作場所中解釋並應用法律要求，行業標準和最佳實踐。
- PILO2 應用風險管理原則預測，識別，評估和控制物理、化學、生物和環境因素等危害。
- PILO3 使用發展、實施和維持的安全管理制度模式，監察和評估健康與安全計劃的實施程序。
- PILO4 通過推廣職業健康與安全的管理體系，文化和實踐，以增強個人的安全意識和持續改善安全管理制度。

4.4 Admission Requirements

General Requirements

Applicants must meet one of the two general requirements below:

- (a) Being a Registered Safety Officer (RSO); and Holding a Bachelor's degree, with at least two years of relevant full-time work experience in the field of occupational safety and health management; or
- (b) Age 18 or above, with at least three years of relevant full-time work experience in the field of occupational safety and health management, supported by a relevant reference letter from the employer.

Chinese Proficiency Requirements

Applicants must meet one of the following Chinese language proficiency requirements:

- HKDSE Chinese Language: Level 2; or
- HKCEE Chinese Language: Grade E; or
- Passing a Chinese oral reading test in an admission interview.

English Proficiency Requirements

Applicants must meet one of the following English language proficiency requirements:

- HKDSE English Language: Level 2; or
- HKCEE English Language (Syllabus B): Grade E; or
- IELTS 5.0 in the recent two years; or
- Previous academic qualification, at QF level 4 or above with QF credits comparable to or more than that of the programme or at Bachelor's degree level, taught and assessed in English.

4.5 Teaching and Learning Activities

The teaching and learning activities of the Programme include lectures, tutorials, workshops, group discussions, presentations and a project.

5. Important Information Regarding this Accreditation Report

5.1 Variation and withdrawal of this Accreditation Report

5.1.1 This Accreditation Report is issued pursuant to section 5 of the AAVQO, and contains HKCAAVQ's substantive determination regarding the accreditation, including the validity period as well as any conditions and restrictions subject to which the determination is to have effect.

5.1.2 HKCAAVQ may subsequently decide to vary or withdraw this Accreditation Report if it is satisfied that any of the grounds set out in section 5 (2) of the AAVQO apply. This includes where HKCAAVQ is satisfied that the Operator is no longer competent to achieve the relevant objectives and/or the Programme no longer meets the standard to achieve the relevant objectives as claimed by the Operator (whether by reference to the Operator's failure to fulfil any conditions and/or comply with any restrictions stipulated in this Accreditation Report or otherwise) or where at any time during the validity period there has/have been substantial change(s) introduced by the Operator after HKCAAVQ has issued the accreditation report(s) to the Operator and which has/have not been approved by HKCAAVQ. Please refer to the '*Guidance Notes on Substantial Change to Accreditation Status*' in seeking approval for proposed changes. These Guidance Notes can be downloaded from the HKCAAVQ website.

5.1.3 If HKCAAVQ decides to vary or withdraw this Accreditation Report, it will give the Operator notice of such variation or withdrawal pursuant to section 5(4) of the AAVQO.

5.1.4 The accreditation status of Operator and/or Programme will lapse immediately upon the expiry of the validity period or upon the issuance of a notice of withdrawal of this Accreditation Report.

5.2 Appeals

5.2.1 If the Operator is aggrieved by the determination made in this Accreditation Report, then pursuant to Part 3 of the AAVQO the Operator has a right of appeal to the Appeal Board. Any appeal must be lodged within 30 days of the receipt of this Accreditation Report.

5.2.2 If the Operator is aggrieved by a decision to vary or withdraw this Accreditation Report, then pursuant to Part 3 of the AAVQO the Operator has a right of appeal to the Appeal Board. Any appeal must be lodged within 30 days of the receipt of the Notice of Withdrawal.

5.2.3 The Operator should be aware that a notice of variation or withdrawal of this Accreditation Report is not itself an accreditation report and the right to appeal against HKCAAVQ's substantive determination regarding accreditation arises only from this Accreditation Report.

5.3 **Qualifications Register**

5.3.1 Qualifications accredited by HKCAAVQ are eligible for entry into the Qualifications Register ("QR") at <https://www.hkqr.gov.hk> for recognition under the QF. The Operator should apply separately to have their quality-assured qualifications entered into the QR.

5.3.2 Only learners who commence the study of the named accredited learning programme during the validity period and who have graduated with the named qualification listed in the QR will be considered to have acquired a qualification recognised under the QF.

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
