This accreditation report is issued by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) in its capacity as the Accreditation Authority as provided for under the Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications Ordinance (Cap 592) (AAVQO). This report outlines the HKCAAVQ's determination, the validity period of the determination as well as any conditions or restrictions on the determination.

## **1. Introduction**

- 1.1 HKCT Institute of Higher Education (the Institute) has been incorporated as a registered company under the Companies Ordinance (Cap 32). The Institute is sponsored by HKCT Group Limited (the Group) which has been incorporated as a registered company under Cap 32, as a company limited by guarantee in the name of Hong Kong College of Technology (Post-Secondary Education) Limited since January 2002 and exempted from tax since February 2004.
- 1.2 Based on the Service Agreement, HKCAAVQ was commissioned by the College to conduct a learning programme accreditation exercise with the following Terms of Reference:
  - (a) To conduct an accreditation test as provided for in the AAVQO to determine whether the Bachelor of Social Sciences (Hons) in Social Development Studies (Social Innovation and the Environment) of HKCT Institute of Higher Education (the Institute) meets the stated objectives and QF standard and can be offered as an accredited programme from the 2016/17 academic year;
  - (b) To issue to the Institute an accreditation report setting out the results of the HKCAAVQ's determination in relation to (a) above.
- 1.3 The accreditation exercise was conducted according to the relevant accreditation guidelines referred to in the Service Agreement and the Terms of Reference stated therein. A site visit took place on 27-29 January 2016.

## 2. HKCAAVQ's Accreditation Determination

Having due consideration of the accreditation panel's observations and comments as presented in this Report, HKCAAVQ makes the following accreditation determination:

### 2.1.1 Requirement

The Institute is to develop separate handbooks for the Social Innovation and the Environment (SIE) internship and attachment in both Chinese and English, including but not limited to:

- (a) Revised Subject Aims and Subject Intended Learning Outcomes to align with SIE specific programme aims and Programme Intended Learning Outcomes;
- (b) Expected scope and tasks of all involved parties;
- (c) Detailed arrangements and procedures to conduct the internship and the attachment in Hong Kong and Mainland China and/or other areas;
- (d) Roles, responsibilities and required qualifications of agency supervisors; and
- (e) Assessment guidelines and tasks.

The Institute is to provide the documents to HKCAAVQ on the fulfilment of the above requirement **on or before 31 December 2016**.

### 2.1.2 Recommendations

- (a) The Institute should continue to review and revise the subject contents for more balanced coverage of the entire field of social innovation and the environment.
- (b) The Institute should develop a comprehensive plan for promotion and assessing the learning outcomes of the new exit award and minimising the attrition rate.
- (c) The Institute should review the academic qualification requirements for the appointment of Associate Professors.

### **3. Programme Details**

The following programme information is provided by the Institute.

3.1 The stream specific Programme Objectives (POs) and Programme Intended Learning Outcomes (PILOs) are revised from the original POs and PILOs of the existent Bachelor of Social Sciences (Hons) in Social Development Studies (BSScSDS) programme to reflect the components of social innovation and the environment. The stream specific POs are to:

- Provide students with global and regional perspectives, knowledge and research skills to identify and analyse social development issues, amid the social, cultural, environmental, economic and political changes in the globalisation, regionalisation and localisation processes, in particular, of Hong Kong and Mainland China;
- Develop critical reflection upon existing solutions and to generate social innovations to these social development issues, especially environmental issues, with global and regional perspectives;
- Equip students with analytical and practical skills through social innovative interventions of social development work to tackle social development issues, especially environmental issues, in the region, in particular, Hong Kong and Mainland China with professionalism; and
- Prepare students' potential careers as social development practitioners applying and promoting social innovations in Hong Kong and Mainland China by enhancing their capabilities through integrated learning with work and research.

3.2 Upon successful completion of the SIE exit award, a graduate would be able to:

- Critically appraise and examine the social phenomena with diverse perspectives, including cultural, historical and technological;
- Command a solid basis of theoretical foundations from multiple disciplines underlying the social development studies, in particular, sociology, social work, political science, economics and ecology;
- Critically analyse the spectrum of specialised knowledge in social development studies ranging from economic, social, environmental, cultural and political analysis, as well as evaluate existing development interventions and formulate reflective and innovative responses with global and regional perspectives;
- Apply effectively a range of transferrable skills, including language, communication, numeracy and information management;
- Perform theoretical and empirical analysis on social development issues, especially environmental issues, and related development interventions, in particular social innovations, in Hong Kong and Mainland China with global and regional perspectives; and
- Perform social development interventions with social innovation approaches professionally and reflectively through working with individuals, groups or communities in the areas of issue identification, needs assessment, service delivery, programme management, advocacy and policy analysis.

### 3.3 Programme Structure

The main features of the new exit award are inclusive community engagement and empowerment of individuals and groups. The programme comprises four components: 1) General Education (GE), 2) Knowledge Foundations: Foundation of Social Sciences, Foundation of Social Development Studies, and Social Development Issues, 3) Practice Knowledge and Skills for Social Development, and 4) Integrated Learning. The structure of the new exit award is summarised below:

### 3.4 Graduation Requirements

To be eligible for graduation, students should pass all the required subjects/credits; and obtain an overall GPA 1.7.

- (f) Equivalent qualifications; and
- (g) Pass the admission interview.

Equivalent qualifications; and

Pass the admission interview.
