Post-accreditation Note:

The Education University of Hong Kong is granted full self-accrediting status effective from 1 April 2018 so that it may determine if a learning programme (whether in teacher education or otherwise) operated by it meets the required standard under the Qualifications Framework and if the qualification obtainable from the completion of the learning programme may be entered into the Qualifications Register.

This accreditation report is issued by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) in its capacity as the Accreditation Authority as provided for under the Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications Ordinance (Cap. 592) (AAVQO). This report outlines the HKCAAVQ's determination, the validity period of the determination as well as any conditions or restrictions on the determination.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Education University of Hong Kong (EdUHK) is one of the eight publicly-funded universities in Hong Kong. It was founded in 1994 as an amalgamation of five teacher training colleges to become the Hong Kong Institute of Education (HKIEd), and retitled to EdUHK in May 2016. The University is now composed of a Graduate School and three Faculties: the Faculty of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (FLASS), the Faculty of Humanities (FHM) and the Faculty of Education and Human Development (FEHD).
- 1.2 The University (HKIEd then) was granted self-accrediting status in 2004 for teacher education programmes at degree level and above. In 2009, it was supported by the Government to develop into an education-focused, research-strong and multi-disciplinary institution. Since then, a number of non-teacher education sub-degree, undergraduate and postgraduate programmes were externally accredited by HKCAAVQ.
- 1.3 HKCAAVQ was commissioned by EdUHK to conduct a learning programme accreditation exercise with the following Terms of Reference:
 - (a) To conduct an accreditation test as provided for in the AAVQO to determine whether the Bachelor of Social Sciences (Honours) in Policy Science and Management programme of EdUHK (the Operator) meets the stated objectives and QF standard and can be offered as an accredited programme from the 2019/20 academic year; and
 - (b) To issue to the Operator an accreditation report setting out the results of the determination in relation to (a) by HKCAAVQ.
- 1.4 The accreditation exercise was conducted according to the relevant accreditation guidelines referred to in the Service Agreement and the Terms of Reference stated therein.

- 1.5 In accordance with HKCAAVQ's differentiation approach to accreditation, an analysis of EdUHK's track record showed that the University has demonstrated institutional effectiveness consistently in programme development and management and met all accreditation criteria in the recent accreditation exercises. As such, a paper-based review was recommended for this exercise with the scope of accreditation customised.

2. HKCAAVQ's Accreditation Determination

Having due consideration of the accreditation panel's observations and comments as presented in this Report, HKCAAVQ makes the following accreditation determination:

3. Programme Details

3.1 Programme Objectives

The Programme aims to provide interdisciplinary training in public policy, governance and public sector management and to equip students with essential skills for careers in public management, policy analysis and evaluation, public and private sector consultancy, the non-profit sector (advocacy and civil society organisations) and government-business relations.

3.2 Programme Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Programme, students will be able to:

PILO1 Understand the principles, theories and practice of policy sciences and public sector management;

PILO2 Apply substantive knowledge of techniques, institutions and processes in public policy and management ();

PILO3 Analyse critically contemporary public policy and

management issues in Hong Kong, Greater China, and Asia from a comparative and multidisciplinary perspective;

PILO4 Apply analytical assessment/evaluation skills to policy and organisational problems;

PILO5 Apply critical thinking skills related to human development in local, national, regional and global contexts;

PILO6 Apply managerial and leadership competence required for effective organisational and public sector management; and

PILO7 Communicate analysis of policy problems and solutions to policy-makers, relevant stakeholders and the broader community.

3.3 Programme Structure

The Programme is a four-year, full-time bachelor's degree programme carrying 121 credits in total. It consists of two entry points: First Year Entry (FYE) at Year 1, and Senior Year Entry (SYE) at Year 3.

3.4 Graduation Requirements

The Programme adopts the university-wide graduation requirements for undergraduate programmes as follows:

- achieve the minimum number of credit points required by the Programme (121 credits for FYE students and 60 credits for SYE students) and satisfy all other programme-specific requirements such as Internship, language exit requirements as well as the Information Technology Competence Test and/or Information Technology Competence in Education required by the University;

- obtain a Programme GPA of 2.00 or above;
- complete at least half of the total required programme credit points at the University and at least half of the required credit points in their major(s) at the University;
- complete the requirements of their first major for undergraduate degree programmes;
- complete the requirements as prescribed by the Programme; and
- obtain a Major Subject GPA of 2.00 or above.

3.5 Admission Requirements

The admission requirements for FYE and SYE, in accordance with the University's general entrance requirements, are as follows:

First Year Entry

- (a) Applicants with Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) qualifications who meet the University's general entrance requirements will be eligible to apply:

Four core subjects and one elective subject with:

- (i) Level 3 or above in English Language and Chinese Language; and
- (ii) Level 2 or above in Mathematics (Compulsory part), Liberal Studies and one elective subject*

* *excluding Applied Learning Chinese and Extended Part in Mathematics*

- (b) Applicants who possess the following non-HKDSE qualifications will be eligible to apply via direct application (i.e. Non-JUPAS application):
- (i) A recognised post-secondary qualification such as an Associate Degree (AD)/Higher Diploma (HD); or
 - (ii) One year of attendance in a recognised AD/HD programme; or
 - (iii) Non-local qualification such as a GCE AL, IB Diploma, High School Graduation Diploma or SAT; or
 - (iv) Current enrolment in a full-time or sandwich Bachelor's degree programme in Hong Kong's UGC-funded institutions/ recognised institutions; or
 - (v) HKALE qualification; or
 - (vi) A mature applicant; or
 - (vii) Possession of other exceptional abilities that merit special consideration.

Senior Year Entry

Eligible AD/HD graduates with good final GPA, or equivalent
