This accreditation report is issued by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) in its capacity as the Accreditation Authority as provided for under the Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications Ordinance (Cap. 592) (AAVQO). This report outlines the HKCAAVQ's determination, the validity period of the determination as well as any conditions or restrictions on the determination.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 Tung Wah College (TWC) is a self-financing tertiary education institution established by the Tung Wah Group of Hospitals (TWGHs). TWC went through an Institutional Review (IR) by HKCAAVQ in October 2010 and was approved by the Chief Executive in Council in 2011 to register under the Post-Secondary Colleges Ordinance (Cap.320) as an approved self-financing degree granting institution.
- 1.2 Tung Wah College (the College/Operator) commissioned HKCAAVQ to conduct learning programme accreditation with the following Terms of Reference:
 - (a) To conduct an accreditation test as provided for in the Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications Ordinance (Cap.592) to determine whether the Bachelor of Management (Honours) in Social and Business Sustainability programme (the Programme) of Tung Wah College meets the stated objectives and QF standard and can be offered as an accredited programme; and
 - (b) To issue to the Operator an accreditation report setting out the results of the determination in relation to (a) by HKCAAVQ.
- 1.3 The accreditation exercise was conducted according to the relevant accreditation guidelines referred to in the Service Agreement and the Terms of Reference stated therein. A site visit took place on 10-11 January 2019.

2. HKCAAVQ's Accreditation Determination

Having due consideration of the accreditation panel's observations and comments as presented in this Report, HKCAAVQ makes the following accreditation determination:

2.1.1 Conditions

Requirements

- (a) The College is required to provide a plan with strategies and identified actions to address (i) how the dual core themes of the Programme (i.e. Business and Social perspectives) will be integrated into (1) the relevant intermediate and advanced level courses, (2) staff development activities, and (3) other related matters where appropriate; and (ii) how the use of technology forms parts of the programme curriculum of different courses in order to achieve the programme objectives and intended learning outcomes. The College is to submit the plan within six months after the commencement of the Programme.
- (b) The College is required to provide a progress report on the implementation of the plan in (a) including assessment of the effectiveness of the implementation. The College is to submit the progress report 12 months after submission of the plan in (a).
- (c) The College is to provide evidence that sufficient teaching staff with the relevant academic qualifications and industry experience are in place to deliver the Programme in its second year of operation. The College is to submit relevant documents including the information on the expertise and qualifications of teaching staff for the courses to be offered for Year 2 and Year 3 students to

HKCAAVQ for the fulfilment of the above requirement on or before **30 June 2020**.

2.1.2 Recommendations

- (a) The Panel recommended that the College should revisit how the practice-based contents should be delivered. The *Capstone Projects and Internship/Practicum* should be a significant part of the programme content. This may also include additional incentives to students for their efforts made to the internships and other learning projects of the Programme to ensure practice-based learning is well incorporated within all relevant subjects.
- (b) The Panel recommended that the College should adopt more innovative and interactive teaching approaches including applications of emerging technologies to support teaching, and solicit input from industry experts and practitioners to enrich students' teaching and learning experiences so as to effectively achieve the PILOs.
- (c) The Panel recommended the College should use more innovative methods for assessing students' performance and put more weight on continuous assessment.
- (d) The Panel recommended that the College should encourage teaching staff to participate in different activities organised by entrepreneurial ventures, NPOs and SEs to raise their awareness of latest development in these sectors so as to facilitate their teaching and/or mentorship.
- (e) The panel recommended that the College should seek a written commitment from TWGHs in regard to providing comprehensive support (e.g. internships, practice advice, networking opportunities) for staff and students to have access to the resources to ensure the PILOs will be achieved.

3. Programme Details

The following programme information is provided by the College.

3.1 Programme Objectives

- To nurture students' capacity in applying knowledge and skills from various business and management disciplines in a social context

where both non-profit and for-profit organisations can pursue both economic and social goals;

- To equip students with transdisciplinary knowledge in designing, launching and implementing successful entrepreneurial ventures with social value and impact so as to create a better world;
- To cultivate students' capacity in thinking in systems, identifying social problems, and defining and designing creative solutions to these problems;
- To train students to competently assess, measure, evaluate and improve the social impact of the activities of both non-profit and for-profit organisations;
- To equip students with effective communication, collaboration and team-building skills; and
- To provide students with general education to encourage them to grasp knowledge from various disciplines, in order to understand self, life and the world.

3.2 Programme Intended Learning Outcomes

- Apply various business and management skills in both non-profit and for-profit organisations, to enable these organisations to achieve both economic and social purposes;
- Demonstrate ability to design, launch and implement successful entrepreneurial ventures with economic and social value and impact;
- Demonstrate ability to assess, measure, evaluate and improve the social impact of for-profit and non-profit organisations;
- Demonstrate social responsibility and environmental awareness, with motivation to address different social issues while bringing economic benefits to organisations;
- Communicate effectively and engage with different stakeholders in both for-profit and non-profit sectors; and
- Exercise intellectual abilities by applying multi-disciplinary knowledge and general skills and engaging in life-long learning, to ensure career mobility and success.

3.4 Graduation Requirements

- Completed 120 TWC credits as prescribed for the Programme with a Graduation Grade Point Average (gGPA) of at least 2.0;
- Achieved GPA of 1.0 or above in all courses of the Programme;
- Satisfied the requirements of the Capstone Project as prescribed for the Programme;
- Completed Work-Integrated Learning Programme which includes (i) at least four College Seminars in each academic year (for both Year 1 and Year 3 entry students) and (ii) a minimum duration of 480 hour discipline-related Internship or Practicum (Optional for Year 3 entry students if they have relevant work experience);
- Completed 30 hours of Community Service; and
- Attained a valid score of 6.0 in IELTS or equivalent (Student would be considered as having fulfilled the requirement if they have obtained a valid score in IELTS or equivalent at the commencement of the Programme.)
