MAY 2019

This accreditation report is issued by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) in its capacity as the Accreditation Authority as provided for under the Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications Ordinance (Cap. 592) (AAVQO). This report outlines the HKCAAVQ's determination, the validity period of the determination as well as any conditions or restrictions on the determination.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 Chu Hai College of Higher Education (the College) was registered in 2004 under the Post Secondary Colleges Ordinance (Cap. 320) as a privately funded, non-profit-making post-secondary college. The College, previously known as Chu Hai University, was a private university founded in 1947 in Guangzhou, China, and subsequently relocated to Hong Kong in 1949 and registered as Chu Hai College under the Education Ordinance (Cap. 279). The College started operating in the current campus near Castle Peak Bay in Tuen Mun in September 2016.
- 1.2 Since its registration as a post-secondary college in 2004, the College has undergone a number of Learning Programme Accreditation (LPA) and Re-accreditation (re-LPA) exercises. The College is currently operating 20 accredited programmes, and has successfully obtained Programme Area Accreditation (PAA) for nine programme areas.
- 1.3 The College commissioned HKCAAVQ to conduct Learning Programme Re-accreditation for the Master of Arts in Chinese Studies Programme (the Programme) with the following Terms of Reference:
 - (a) To conduct an accreditation test as provided for in the AAVQO to determine whether the Master of Arts in Chinese Studies Programme of Chu Hai College of Higher Education (the Operator) meets the stated objectives and QF standard and can continue to be offered as an accredited programme from the 2019/20 academic year; and
 - (b) To issue to the Operator an accreditation report setting out the results of the determination in relation to (a) by HKCAAVQ.
- 1.4 The accreditation exercise was conducted according to the relevant accreditation guidelines referred to in the Service Agreement and the Terms of Reference stated therein. A site visit took place on 28-29 March 2019.

2.1.1 Conditions

Requirement

The College is to adhere to the stipulated admission requirements to ensure that students admitted to the Programme have the relevant knowledge and skills to be able to undertake the learning activities. The College is to submit to HKCAAVQ the relevant documentary evidence to demonstrate that student intakes for the academic year 2019/20 met the admission requirements of the Programme on or before 31 December 2019.

2.1.2 Recommendations

- (a) The College should review the programme content, structure and the arrangements of *MA Dissertation* to better meet the diverse academic backgrounds and learning needs of students.
- (b) The College should put in place a robust procedure to monitor the continuous improvement of the Programme and formalise the feedback and consultation channels with the external examiners and advisors.

3. Programme Details

The following programme information is provided by the operator.

3.1 Programme Objectives

- To train and nurture specialist professionals equipped with a solid and firm foundation of Chinese Studies to function in the present society by using and applying the wisdom of Chinese Studies;
- To train research students in the areas of literature, history and philosophy to integrate and retrieve Chinese Studies related research material and data for application in various professional sectors (such as school management and teachers, professional management in enterprises);

- To train and nurture research students by acquainting them with the tradition of Chinese Studies, to enable them to appreciate the changes in today's society, so as to build up their independent judgement and thinking to develop innovative concepts in their research areas;
- To train research students to make effective use of modern information technology to enhance their related research data appraisals and analyses;
- To train research students in academic research methodology for leading data collection, appraisal and research work;
- To nurture and foster a positive life's view through exploring and researching in various areas of literature, history and philosophy for shouldering responsibilities and commitments towards society and the nation: and
- To train and nurture in research students the ability to make independent decisions, to communicate, interflow and interact with academic circles for promoting and mobilising academic and cultural development.

3.2 Programme Intended Learning Outcomes

- To demonstrate complete and thorough knowledge and appreciation of Chinese Studies for functioning as professional literary and academic specialists;
- To demonstrate the capability to build up a literary and Confucian research system for related deep-structure research work;
- To analyse the quelling of political upheavals and the rise and decline in history and cultural development processes by making effective use of historical and cultural knowledge and research methodologies, so as to arrive at a thorough appreciation of special cultural features and historical realities through manipulating cultural and historical knowledge, to throw light on the present by reviewing the past;
- To marshal a thorough grasp of analytical thinking abilities and apply the wisdom of philosophical thoughts in modern living; and

To nurture and foster independent thinking and research capabilities by integrating and inter-relating various areas in literature, Confucian studies, history, culture and philosophical thinking.

3.3 Programme Structure

3.3.1 The Programme is a one-year full-time or two-year part-time taught Masters programme. Students are required to take 2 compulsory courses and 6 elective courses according to their specialisation and interests. The structure of the Programme is shown below:

3.4 Graduation Requirements

- completed all coursework required with a total of 30 credits obtained:
- fulfilled 70% or above of the attendance requirement; and
- obtained a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0.

3.5 Admission Requirements

- 1. Holding a recognised Bachelor Degree or Equivalent Qualification.
 - Applicants must have studied Chinese literature, Chinese history, Chinese thought or related discipline as major. Applicants based on qualifications in other disciplines are required to complete courses such as History of Chinese Literature and General Chinese History or History of Chinese Thought at Bachelor level.
- 2. English language proficiency requirement.
 - a. Holding a degree from a university in Hong Kong or any English-speaking country; OR
 - b. Scoring a Pass in English in Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (DSE); OR
 - c. In the case of holding a degree NOT from a university in Hong Kong or any English-speaking country, score of one of the following international English language proficiency tests, viz.:
 - i. TOEFL (writing not lower than 500; machine test not lower than 213; on-line test not lower than 79):OR
 - ii. IELTS (Academic Paper) (Total score not lower than 6.0) OR
 - iii. CET4 (Overall not lower than 425); OR
 - iv. PETS-5 (PASS in both oral and written parts)
